## Circle Quilts - Summer Storm Quilt Project

When choosing fabrics large scale prints may become lost in this design. You can use as few as two fabrics or as many as sixteen. Changing the number of fabrics will require that you change the fabric labels on the pattern pieces.

## Fabric Requirements

Fabrics A, B, C, and D 7/8 yard each

Binding ½ yard

Cutting Directions – cut strips selvage to selvage

Fabric A, B, and C Cut the same strips from each fabric

Cut  $1 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip for center section

Cut  $4 - 4\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for Rings #1, #2, and #3

Fabric D Cut  $1 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip for center section

Cut  $2 - 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips for Rings #1 and #2

Cut  $1 - 5 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip for Ring #3

Binding Cut 110" of 2 ½" wide bias binding

## What to bring to class:

neutral piecing thread; invisible thread – I recommend Superior's New Mono Poly sewing machine with zigzag stitch capability in good working order, with power cord, and foot pedal

Open toed foot or see-through foot and extension table (desirable but not mandatory)

Sharp Needles (size 80) and pins (straight for piece work)

Extra bobbins

Scissors – one pair for paper and one pair for fabric/threads

Rotary cutter, cutting ruler (1" x 6" or larger) and mat (9" x 12" or larger)

Seam ripper

Tweezers, optional but handy

Spray Sizing or Fabric Finish – I prefer Magic Spray Sizing (can share with friends)

Thread catcher and/or garbage sack

All your fabrics pre-cut and labeled as shown above and all the leftovers Your copy of *Circle Quilts*, is very handy to have.
